

REACCREDITATION CRITERIA

Technical Officials updating their officiating accreditation will need to satisfy the following criteria:


- Produce a completed SAL Technical Official Accreditation Update Log showing the required number of update points to maintain the current level of accreditation. This can be in the form of a log book (downloaded from the SAL website) or by inputting points in to the MyLANE portal. MyLANE is a new personalised online member portal that displays news from National, State and Club level, view upcoming events as well as allowing technical officials to add in points towards their re-accreditation.
- 2. Completed all necessary practical hours and assessment over the 4 year period.

REACCREDITATION PROCESS / HOW TO UPDATE

The below table shows what the re-accreditation requirements (minimum number of points, practical hours etc) are for each accreditation / level.

Points can be attained by officiating at any level of swim meets or by attending various workshops. Points are also awarded for individuals who have completed listed courses.
