

## REACCREDITATION CRITERIA

Technical Officials updating their officiating accreditation will need to satisfy the following criteria:

1. Produce a completed SAL Technical Official Accreditation Update Log showing the required number of update points to maintain the current level of accreditation. This can be in the form of a log book (downloaded from the SAL website) or by inputting points in to the MyLANE portal. MyLANE is a new personalised online member portal that displays news from National, State and Club level, view upcoming events as well as allowing technical officials to add in points towards their re-accreditation.
2. Completed all necessary practical hours and assessment over the 4 year period.

## REACCREDITATION PROCESS / HOW TO UPDATE

The below table shows what the re-accreditation requirements (minimum number of points, practical hours etc) are for each accreditation / level.

Points can be attained by officiating at any level of swim meets or by attending various workshops. Points are also awarded for individuals who have completed listed courses.

Judge of Stroke, Inspector of Turns	Minimum 50 points required	Minimum 50 hours
Level 1 Referee / Starter	Minimum 75 points	Minimum 75 hours
Level 2 Referee / Starter	Minimum 100 points	Minimum 100 hours
Level 3 Referee / Starter	Minimum 200 points	Minimum 120 hours

## LIST OF SWIMMING OFFICIATING ACTIVITIES & UPDATING POINTS

The below information outlines the various activities that can be undertaken to achieve the required points to re-accredit. Individuals have a 4 year period to achieve the required number of points.

Technical Official at Australian Age / Short Course Championships	12 per day
Technical Official at other SAL organized event	10 per day

### STATE

	<i>Points</i>
Referee/Starter at State Championships	15 per day
Technical Official (other than Referee/Starter) at State Championships	5 per day
Technical Official at other State / Territory sanctioned event	5 per day
Technical Official at non sanctioned event – School meet / encouragement meet	2 per day

### CLUB / REGION

	<i>Points</i>
Referee/Starter at Club or Regional Event	10 per day
Technical Official (other than Referee/Starter) at Club or District / Regional event	3 per day
Officiated in any of the following positions at a Masters Swimming Australia event: Timekeeper, Chief Timekeeper, Clerk of Course, Check Starter, Inspector of Turns, Judge of Stroke & Starter	2 per day
