EBL 1
(CBL 1)

Conducting Swimming Events in South Australia

- (a) Approved swimming events in South Australia shall be conducted under the rules and by-laws of FINA and World Para Swimming, except in so far as they are varied by these by-laws.
- (b) All events conducted by SwimmingSA shall be conducted under the rules of SwimmingSA including these by-laws unless otherwise notified prior to the event.
- (c) All events conducted by SwimmingSA districts and clubs shall be conducted under these by-laws unless granted prior approval by SwimmingSA.
 - All events requesting approval must be applied for prior to the event and must meet the minimum standard for approval as per Open Carnival Policy.
- (d) All events requesting approval of results being conducted by an organisation that is not a member of SwimmingSA shall be conducted under these by-laws unless granted prior approval by SwimmingSA. SwimmingSA is not responsible for sourcing insurance for such events and will only support events that meet SwimmingSA criteria.

EBL 1.1 Competing at Swimming Events in or external to South Australia

- (a) Clubs may not compete against other Clubs or other bodies without the prior approval of the Board.
- (b) Registered Club Members may not compete outside of South Australia or Broken Hill without the prior approval of the Board.
- (c) Clubs shall not compete in events, other than at school meets or at meets specifically conducted by Swimming SA, with persons who are not Registered Members, nor shall specific events for persons who are not Registered Members be conducted at meets run under the auspices of Swimming SA, unless the events have been specifically sanctioned by the Board. Board sanction shall apply to a specific instance of an event only.

EBL 2
(CBL 2)

Date and Location of Swimming Events in South Australia

SwimmingSA events shall be conducted in South Australia and/or Broken Hill subject to the suitability of facilities at the selected location.

EBL 2.1 The dates of all approved swimming events in South Australia shall be determined by the Board. Any Club or Member seeking permission to conduct an event must apply to the Board in a form as determined by the Board from time to time.

EBL 2.2 No Club or District Association will be permitted to conduct an event (approved or not) during the period of any South Australian State Championship Event.

EBL 2.3 No Club or District Association will be permitted to conduct an event (approved or not) during the period of any approved Non-Championship meet conducted by:

- SwimmingSA; and/or
- The District to which the club is assigned; and/or
- Another approved club without written consent from SwimmingSA.

South Australian Open Swimming Championships

SwimmingSA shall each year conduct the:

- South Australian Open Long Course Swimming Championships (50m); and
- South Australian Open Short Course Swimming Championships (25m).

The order of events and the duration of the championships shall be approved by the Board. The following events shall be contested by both male and females:

Butterfly	50m, 100m and 200m
Individual Medley	200m and 400m

Club Mixed Medley Relay	4x 50m
Club Mixed Freestyle Relay	4x 50m

EBL 5 **South Australian Open Water Swimming Championships**
(CBL 6)

SwimmingSA shall each year conduct the South Australian Open Water Swimming Championships. (Refer to the OWS Rules and By-Laws for additional information)

EBL 6 **South Australian Country Swimming Championships**

SwimmingSA shall each year conduct the South Australian Country Swimming Championships with the program format approved by the Board.

It is preferable that this event is conducted in a Long Course (50m) pool.

The follow Open events will be considered for inclusion for both males and females as part of the Championships:

Freestyle	50m, 100m, 800m and 1500m
Backstroke	50m, 100m and 200m
Breaststroke	50m, 100m and 200m
Butterfly	50m, 100m and 200m
Individual Medley	400m
Club Medley Relay	4x 50m and 4x100m
Club Freestyle Relay	4x 50m and 4x100m
Club Mixed Medley Relay	4x 50m
Club Mixed Freestyle Relay	4x 50m

These events may be swum separate to age group events or medals may be awarded upon cumulation of age group results for the relevant event. Results may be collated from heats or final swims and medals awarded accordingly.

EBL 7 **Classification**
(CBL 7)

South Australian swimming events for nationally and internationally classified swimmers with an impairment shall be conducted in multi-class (MC) format. Swimmers must hold an eligible classification as outlined in CBL 11. Heats shall be seeded according to SW 3 in the Swimming Australia Swimming Rules. Placings for each event shall be determined using the multi-class point score system.

In accordance with MC 2.17 a classified swimmer may require assistance from support staff.

Swimmers with a classification may compete in events which are or are not designated as

multi-class. For events not designated as multi-class the swimmer's exemptions only apply if the same event is not offered on the program. not apply.

The Referee must clear the pool before and after each heat in MC events. For MC swimmers competing in standard heats, the Referee may choose to waive this instruction.

EBL 8 Qualifying Times

(CBL 8)

SwimmingSA shall adopt a qualifying time or break time for each distance and stroke and/or classification for all SwimmingSA events in accordance with the level of competition. Advice of the approved times are published in the handbook of Events, on Swim Central and on the SwimmingSA website.

EBL 8.1

The qualifying times for South Australian Long Course Age and Open Championships, must have been achieved at an approved meet in a 50m pool using electronic timing (including semi-automatic timing (SAT) at anytime after 1 October two years prior to the year in which the events are held.

EBL 8.2

The qualifying times for South Australian Short Course Age and Open Championships must have been achieved at an approved meet in a 25m pool, using electronic timing (including SAT) at any time after 1 October two years prior to the year in which the events are held. For swimmers who do not have a time in a 25m pool, a time in a 50m pool will be accepted without any conversion factor. Swimmers who do not have a time in a 25m pool, will be seeded on the event qualifying time when the event is held in a 25m pool.

EBL 8.3

The qualifying times for the South Australian Country Championships must have been achieved at an approved meet in a 25m or 50m pool using electronic timing (including SAT) at any time on or after 1 October two years prior to the year in which the championships are held. For swimmers who do not have a time in a 25m pool, a time in a 50m pool will be accepted without any conversion factor. Swimmers who do not have a time in a 50m pool, will be seeded on the event qualifying time when the event is held in a 50m pool.

EBL 8.4

Qualifying, Division or Break times for any SwimmingSA approved non-Championship event will be ratified by the event host as determined to be appropriate for the level of competition. Such times must be advertised prior to entries closing for the event and must be made available through the online entry portal. Times may be restricted by (but not limited to):

- Long or Short Course or Yards
- 2yr or 3yr qualifying period
- Seeded by time or by the qualifying time
- Restricted to times previously achieved at events hosted by the meet host or not
- A maximum number of places available to swimmers in the event or meet

Note: Conversion factors should not be used.

EBL 8.5

Qualifying times must be achieved at a properly approved meet.

Note: Qualifying times achieved at meets conducted by school and other kindred association must conform to the current SwimmingSA School Swim Meet policy.

EBL 9 Facility Requirements

(CBL 9)

- EBL 9.1** Standards for FINA Olympic Pools are found on the FINA website, www.fina.org under FINA Facilities.
- EBL 9.2** For South Australian Championships the Board may approve a venue pool of lesser standard than stated in EBL 9.1, provided that:
- (a) the length is not less than 50 metres for Long Course and not less than 25 metres for Short Course; and
 - (b) there is a minimum of 8 lanes and preferably 10; and
 - (c) the water is heated and preferably covered; and
 - (d) adequate warm up and swim down facilities; and
 - (e) Automatic Officiating Equipment is available; and
 - (f) The venue holds a minimum of 1600 seats for attendees.
- EBL 9.3** For Country Championships refer to SwimmingSA Policy Statements ([Click Here](#))
- EBL 9.4** Club and District Events and training activities must be held in a recognised pool. A recognised pool is one which is included in the Pool Depth Guidelines ([Click Here](#)) and deemed suitable for use under EBL 9.5
- EBL 9.5** As a minimum all swimming activities including competition events and training conducted by a club or district must be conducted in accordance with the Pool Depth Policy. ([Click Here](#))

EBL 10 Terms and Conditions of Entry

(CBL 10)

- EBL 10.1** Participants and spectators must adhere to the following ([Click Here to view](#)):
- Venue terms and conditions of entry
 - SwimmingSA membership terms and conditions
 - SwimmingSA rules, policies, and code of conduct
 - Safe Sport Framework
- EBL 10.2** All entrants in an approved swimming event in South Australia (or if under the age of 18 years their parent or guardian) shall declare themselves fit to compete. If an entrant experiences a medical issue whilst competing at, or during an event, the entrant will be required to provide a medical clearance from a health care professional before being allowed to resume competition. The Meet Director/Technical Manager will have the sole authority to adjudicate on this rule.
- EBL 10.3** SwimmingSA events are conducted in an alcohol and smoke free environment unless otherwise stated.

Consumption by event attendees and/or distribution of (free or otherwise) Alcohol by Clubs and Districts hosting events is strictly prohibited without SwimmingSA approval.

Advertising of sponsors associated with a Club of District who are:

- members of; or
- sellers of; or
- producers of a category of beverage that is represented by Alcohol Beverages Australia (ABA) is permitted.

The advertising seen through sports sponsorships is regulated through the Alcohol Beverages Advertising Code (ABAC) – a robust independent system with a government representative in its five-strong Management Committee. This ensures the content of the advertisements does not have strong or evident appeal to minors or encourage irresponsible consumption.

All advertising at Swimming Events in South Australia must meet the advertising EBL 25 and the ABAC. [Click Here](#) for information.

EBL 11 **Eligibility**
(CBL 11)

- (a) Events hosted by SwimmingSA, Districts or Clubs (Approved or Non-Approved) are open to Swimmers who:
 - are eligible to represent South Australia; and
 - are registered with a South Australian Club; and
 - meet the entry qualifying time as per EBL 8; and
 - meet any relevant EBL 11 eligibility criteria for the particular event.
- (b) Any person who has been/currently is a member of a SA Club may transfer to another SA Club and shall swim unattached for a period of 90 days. They shall not score points for their new club and shall not compete in Club relays. This does not apply if they have transferred from another State to SA.
- (c) All swimmers who are not registered with a South Australian club will be classed as visitors.
- (d) Each swimmer entered may be subject to doping control tests as determined by the appropriate doping authority.
- (e) Certain events may also be open to those swimmers who meet any of the following EBL 11 Eligibility criteria as advertised for a particular event.

EBL 11.1 **Visitor Eligibility**

Should a particular event be open to swimmers who are not members of a South Australian club each swimmer must satisfy either 11.1 (a) or (b) below; and

- will be considered a visitor for the event; and
 - will not be eligible to represent or score points for a South Australian club or district.
- (a) Swimmers who are registered with an Australian Club and meet the entry qualifying time as per CBL 8; or
 - (b) Members of other federations affiliated to FINA who meet the entry qualifying time as per EBL8 and hold a valid clearance from their federation.

EBL 11.2 **Country Championships Eligibility**

A competitor in the Country Championships must be:

- (a) A registered member of a SwimmingSA Country club and have had their permanent place of residence in a Country district for a period of 28 days prior to the first day of the meet; or
- (b) a registered member of a SwimmingSA Country club and not have been a member of a Metropolitan club during the 12 months preceding the first day of the meet; or
- (c) a registered member of a Swimming Australia Affiliated Country Club who has been granted clearance to compete from their State Association; or
- (d) a registered member of a Federation affiliated with Fédération Internationale de Natation (FINA) who has been granted clearance to compete from their federation and who is currently training with a Australian Country Club; or
- (e) a registered member of a club invited by the SwimmingSA Board.

EBL 11.3 Swimmers with an Impairment Eligibility

All approved events in South Australia are open to Swimmers with an impairment who may compete in multi-class or able body events or a combination of both as available at a particular event.

- (a) Swimmers with an impairment wishing to compete in events designated as Multi-Class must hold a classification according to the classification database held by Swimming Australia in line with eligibility requirements outlined in the Swimming Australia Classification Policy and procedures for classes 1-10 (physical), 11-13 (vision), 14 (intellectual), 15 (hearing), 16 (transplant) and 17 (transition).
- (b) A swimmer's national or international classification must be current to compete.
- (c) A swimmer who holds a provisional or expired classification will be allowed to compete at all events until they are called in for their next classification assessment.
- (d) A swimmer who holds an expired classification and who have not reported for their scheduled renewal appointment will be considered exhibition swimmers at Championship events.

EBL 11.4 Eligibility - Age

- (a) A minimum or maximum age for a limited age competition or event will be stipulated in the event information for the relevant event. Refer to the online entry system ([Click Here](#)) for details.
- (b) The minimum age for swimmers entering individual events at the South Australian Open Championships is 12 years for girls, 13 years for boys and 10 years for MC swimmers as at the first day of competition.
- (c) The minimum age for swimmers entering individual events at State Age and Country Championships is 10yrs as at the first day of competition.
- (d) The minimum age for swimmers entering relay events at State and Country Championships is 8yrs as at the first day of competition.
- (e) The minimum age for any swimmer at a non-Championship event may be specified in the relevant event information. Regardless of a specified minimum age (or not) the minimum standard for entry to a SwimmingSA Approved Event or an event hosted by a Club or District is the ability for the swimmer to safely complete the distance of the event in which they are entering. Some events will require waivers for competition.
- (f) Each swimmer may be asked to produce a birth certificate or statutory declaration to confirm their age.

EBL 11.5 Swimmers Ineligible to Compete

(CBL 11.2)

- (a) In the event of a question arising as to the eligibility of any swimmer under CBL 11, the swimmer affected will need to refer the question to the Board of SwimmingSA and its determination shall be final.
- (b) Events for swimmer's ineligible to compete according to any SwimmingSA Clause within the SwimmingSA Constitution, By-Laws, Event By-Laws and/or Swimming Rules shall not be conducted at the same meet without permission of the Board.

EBL 12 **Entries**
(CBL 12)

- (a) International swimmers interested in entering Australian swimming events must contact SwimmingSA for entry details
- (b) All entries from members of Australian Clubs are to be submitted via the online entry system (Swim Central) prior to the published closing date. Online entries will close no earlier than 21 days prior to the start of competition for SwimmingSA approved events.
- (c) Late entries may be considered by the Event Host and if accepted, a late entry fee will be charged.
- (d) An entry fee shall be determined by the Event Host and charged for:
 - Each individual event or team entry; and/or
 - Each swimmer per meet
- (e) A maximum number of entries or entry limits may apply to individual and/or relay events at the discretion of the Event Host and must be adhered to.
- (f) Unlimited entries for all individual events at Championship Events shall be accepted provided the qualifying times are achieved as per EBL 8.
- (g) Only recognised Clubs, Districts, States or Federations have the authority to nominate swimmers for relay events at SwimmingSA competitions.

EBL 13 **Team Managers Meeting**
(CBL 13)

A team managers meeting shall be held prior to competition at an advertised time and place and in one of the following formats:

- Prior to the first day of the meet (electronically)
- On the first day of the meet (in person)
- Prior to the start of each day of a multi-day meet (in person)
- As called by the Chairman of Directors, Chief Executive Officer, Meet Director, Technical Manager or Referee of the event (electronically or in person)

This meeting is the opportunity for Team Managers ([Click Here for Policy Information](#)) to lodge any split, withdrawal or relay nomination forms and discuss any errors or omissions with the Meet Director or their nominated representative. Any updated competition information will be provided to the managers at this meeting. Refer to EBL 22 in relation to lodging Relay Sheets.

EBL 14 **Conduct at Swimming Events**
(CBL 14)

All attendees must abide by the Swimming Australia Code of Conduct, Safe Sport and Integrity Policies, Event and Venue Entry Terms and Conditions (see EBL 10).

Betting shall not be allowed at an event and it shall be the duty of every member and attendee to take the best means in its power to enforce this Rule. Any Club or Member failing to take prompt measures to suppress betting at its meets shall be liable to suspension for such times as the Board may deem necessary.

EBL 15 Reporting for Distance Events & Marshalling

(CBL 15)

EBL 15.1 One event is defined as including ALL heats of that event. For competitions with marshalling, any swimmer entered in the first or second events who fails to report to the Marshalling area at least ten (10) minutes prior to the scheduled time for the start of the session on that day, is deemed to have withdrawn from that event. Once the competition has started, any swimmer who fails to report at least two (2) events prior to the event in which they are entered, shall be deemed to be withdrawn.

EBL 15.2 In events with timed finals where the fastest heat/s is swum in the evening session, all intending swimmers for every heat must marshal in the morning session. Swimmers are required to declare their intent to swim by no later than two events prior to the first timed final in the heats session

EBL 15.5 The provided Timeline is a guide only. EBL 15.1 & 2 must be adhered to.

EBL 16 Withdrawals

(CBL 16)

EBL 16.1 In all competitions, finalists, semi-finalists and all reserves up to and including thirtieth place (30th) wishing to be withdrawn from a semi-final or final shall do so in writing and signed by the competitor or their authorised representative within thirty (30) minutes following the posting of the results for that event. Once a withdrawal form has been submitted, the swimmer cannot be reinstated.

EBL 16.2 An entrant not having withdrawn as required in EBL 15.3 who does not compete in the event, shall be deemed a late withdrawal and the Club with which the entrant is registered shall be fined the sum of \$100.00. This fine may be waived where there are medical reasons or proven hardship. The Technical Manager and/or the Referee shall determine the acceptability on all matters and their determination shall be final.

EBL 16.3 Entries for future South Australian swimming events will not be accepted by SwimmingSA for swimmers who have not paid fines outlined in EBL16.2.

CBL 17 Swim-offs

EBL 17.1 At Championship events swim-offs may be required in the event of a tie for:

- 10/11 place for a final or 12/13 place for reserves (where 10 lanes are used); or
- 8/9 place for a final or 10/11 place for reserves (where 8 lanes are used); or
- 7/8 place for a final or 9/10 place for reserves (where 7 lanes are used)

EBL 17.2 An announcement will be made for the team managers to report to the Control Room where they will be advised that a swim off may be required.

CBL 17.3 The Technical Manager is responsible for arranging the swim-off and will instruct the session Referee and Control Room Supervisor when the swim-off will take place. The swim-off will be scheduled in a timely manner. Wherever possible, this will be immediately following the conclusion of the 30 minutes from the closing time for withdrawals from the respective event to enable final results to be published.

EBL 17.4 By accepting their place in the swim-off a swimmer has indicated their intention to swim in the final (or be a reserve for the final) and may not withdraw after the swim off.

EBL 18 Semi-finals and B Finals

(CBL 18)

EBL 18.1 Semi-finals may be conducted for Long or Short Course Events. Further to this A and B finals may also be conducted as prescribed in the Event information Book for the relevant Event.

EBL 18.2 B finals will be conducted for the South Australian Long Course Open Championships for the 50m, 100m, and 200m events provided at least 20 competitors contest the heats. After withdrawals should there be less than the following number of swimmers registered to compete in the A and B final then the B final may be cancelled:

- 13 swimmers (where 10 lanes are in use for the meet); or
- 11 swimmers (where 8 lanes are in use for the meet).

EBL 19 Timed Finals

EBL 19.1 All events conducted at Non-Championship competitions are deemed to be timed finals unless otherwise stated in event specific information.

EBL 19.2 When the 400m, 800m and 1500m Freestyle, and the 400m Individual Medley for both male and female are contested at a Championship Event, places shall be awarded based on times (i.e. no final will be held). Swimmers will be seeded in heats according to fastest declared time. The sequence shall be on the basis of slowest heat first and fastest heat last. These events may be conducted in either heats or finals sessions according to programming requirements.

EBL 19.3 All multi-class Championship events are designated as Timed Finals

EBL 19.4 Short Course Championship events may be designated as Timed Finals

EBL 19.5 Club relays shall be conducted as timed finals

EBL 20 Finals, Placings and Awards

(cbl 20)

EBL 20.1 Championship Finals

All swimmers must compete in the heats and achieve the championship event qualifying time to compete in a final; and

EBL 20.2 Long Course State Championships

(a) For the SA Open LC Championships – When conducted as a standalone event (Separate from the Age Championships) Open Finals will be conducted; and:

- A and B finals will be swum as per EBL 18.2
- There will be a maximum of three (3) visitors per A Final and an unrestricted number in the B Final; or

(b) For the SA Age LC Championships – When conducted as a standalone event (Separate from the Open Championships) Age Finals will be conducted; and:

- Finals will be swum in the appropriate age groups; and
- Only A finals will be conducted with a maximum of two (2) visitors per age group final unless there are not enough South Australians to fill all final places.

(c) For a combined SA Age and Open LC Championships – All swimmers swim in the heats and based upon heat times open medals will be awarded for those events where both age group and open medals are offered; and

- Finals will be swum in the appropriate age groups; and
- Only A finals will be conducted with a maximum of two (2) visitors per age group final unless there are not enough South Australians to fill all final places.

EBL 20.3 Short Course Championships

For the SA SC Championships – Finals may be conducted where the facility and programming allows time to do so. Finals will be conducted in one of the three formats noted above in EBL 20.2 (a), (b) and (c).

EBL 20.4 Country Championships

For the SA Country Championships - Finals may be conducted where the facility and programming allows time to do so; and:

- All swimmers swim in the heats and based upon heat times open medals will be awarded for those events where both age group and open medals are offered; and
- Finals will be swum in the appropriate age groups; and
- Only A finals will be conducted with a maximum of two (2) visitors per age group final unless there are not enough South Australians to fill all final places.

EBL 20.5 Placings for Multi-Class Events

Placings will be determined from the Multi Class Point Score System.

Highest point scoring swimmers will be declared the winner of the event.

EBL 20.6 Championship Placings and Medals

(a) The winner, second, and third place-getters in each Championship event shall receive a medallion of special design. The first medallion shall be of gold colour, the second medallion shall be of silver colour and the third of bronze colour. Further to this the first three South Australian registered swimmers shall be awarded Gold (1st SA Swimmer), Silver (2nd SA Swimmer) and Bronze (3rd SA Swimmer) medals.

No medal shall be awarded if the place-getter fails to achieve the qualifying time set for the event or is disqualified.

(b) The fastest swimmer eligible to represent South Australia to finish in each Championship event shall receive the title of "South Australian Champion or South Australian Country Champion". In the event of any swimmer who is not eligible to represent South Australia gaining 1st, 2nd or 3rd place, a medallion shall be awarded similar to that given by SwimmingSA to any eligible swimmer gaining such a place.

EBL 20.7 Non-Championship Awards

(a) All competitors will accumulate points towards the SwimmingSA seasonal Club Pennants for the Long Course and Short Course Season. Points will be awarded at all non-championship meets conducted by SwimmingSA (All in, Division1, Christmas Cracker).

(b) The following SwimmingSA Pennants will be awarded each season:

- Handicap Pennant awarded to the club with the highest handicap percentage at the end of each LC and SC season. The formula for calculating the handicap percentage is: number of points scored divided by number of swimmers entered (calculated at the conclusion of each meet, awarded at the end of the series). Where a team enters five or less competitors, the total points scored will be divided by five.

(c) Clubs and districts may award recognition to individuals, clubs or districts in the form of certificates, medals, ribbons, trophies, pennants or cash prizes so long as the following conditions are observed:

- All awards must be advertised prior to the close of entries for the event including the process by which these awards are obtained by a team or individual; and
- Any cash prize must be awarded ensuring the sports match fixing, gambling and betting policies are observed; and
- Sponsor prizes may be awarded but must not include alcohol or tobacco irrespective of the age of the recipient or event type.

EBL 20.8 Records

SwimmingSA shall recognise age and open records in events, which are included on the programme. (Refer to SSA Swimming Rule SW 12 for further detail) SwimmingSA also recognises Multi-Class open records for each classification for both males and females in LC and SC events. Age records are also held for each classification in the age groups 12 & under, 13-15 and 16-18 years.

EBL 21 Pointscore & Perpetual Trophies

(CBL 23)

EBL 21.1 Pointscore

For the purpose of determining Awards based upon Accumulated Points the representatives of the Club gaining places shall be awarded the following points:

EBL 21.2 If a visitor is placed in an event they shall score the same points as if a South Australian registered swimmer had achieved this place, i.e. no swimmer in the top 10 will need to have their points adjusted.

EBL 21.3 Points shall only be awarded to swimmers or teams achieving the qualifying time in the final or timed final.

EBL 21.4 Where a swimmer who competed is disqualified the position the swimmer would have held shall be awarded to the swimmer who finished next. All the lower placing swimmers shall be advanced one place and club points will be adjusted accordingly. If the disqualification occurs or a protest changes the result after the presentation of awards, the awards shall be returned and given to the appropriate swimmers applying the aforesaid provisions and announced accordingly..

EBL 21.5 Pointscore for Championship Events

(a) For any event with a qualifying time this must be achieved at the event (in the Final or Timed Final) for points to be awarded.

(b) Places will be awarded from 1st thru 10th when ten lanes are used. Where less than 10 lanes are in use at the event the places and points awarded will be according to the total number of lanes in use.

IE. When eight lanes are used, points will only be awarded to eighth place and where 7 lanes are used, points will be awarded to 7th place and so forth.

EBL 21.6 Pointscore for Non-Championship Events

(a) Points will be awarded to swimmers and teams placed 1st thru 10th in all approved non-championship events hosted by SwimmingSA, districts and clubs.

(b) Where relevant points will be accumulated towards the awarding of Perpetual Trophies.

EBL 21.7 Perpetual Trophies

Trophies will be awarded to South Australian registered swimmers and clubs only.

EBL 22 Club Relays

(CBL 21)

EBL 22.1 A list of swimmers (up to eight) intending to swim in relays must be provided at the time of nominations. All relay nominations are to be submitted via the online entry portal.

- EBL 22.2** In heats, timed final and final relay events, the names of the swimmers and reserve swimmers and the order in which they are to swim shall be submitted in writing, on the prescribed form to the Control Room Supervisor or their representative:
- at the Team Managers Meeting held one hour prior to the commencement of the session at which the relay event is to be swum.
 - If there is no team managers meeting for that session, then sheets must be handed in at the team managers meeting at the earlier session.
 - Permitted late changes must be handed to the Control Room Supervisor (CRS) at least one (1) hour prior to the start time of the relevant session.
 - Substitutions in relay teams at Championship meets may only be made from swimmers already entered in the meet database.
 - At other meets, any substitutions of swimmers who are not already entered in the meet database will result in the team being classified as an exhibition team

EBL 22.3 The composition of a relay team may be changed between heats and finals provided however when a club enters more than one (1) relay team in an event, swimmers may not be interchanged between the teams. (See also SW 10.12)

EBL 22.4 Non-Australian citizens who are not members of another federation affiliated to FINA, may compete in relays and score points for an Australian Club, district or state.

EBL 22.5 In Club relay events a maximum of two teams from the same Club may contest the event. However no more than two teams from the same Club shall contest the final of an event (where heats and finals are to be conducted); and only one team can score points and receive medals.

EBL 22.6 Regional Relays – Country Championships

At the Country Championships two teams per district will be accepted per event observing the following criteria:

- (a) The team is made up of swimmers from a minimum of two different clubs eligible to represent the region; and
- (b) If entering two regional teams, any combination of the total number of swimmers must not be able to form an individual club team for the event.

Regional relay teams will be treated in the same manner as visitors and will therefore receive a visitor's medal, score points and proceed to any finals accordingly. Regional relays will be eligible for SA Country Records.

EBL 22.7 Regional Relays – State Championships

At the SA Championships, Regional relay entries will be accepted from SA Country Regions only. A maximum of two teams may be submitted per region. These teams will be considered as South Australian and will be ranked accordingly with the other competing clubs.

EBL 22.8 Swimmers may on swim for their Club once in one of each of the following Open events:

4x50m Freestyle Relay	4x100m Freestyle Relay	4x50m Mixed Medley Relay
4x50m Medley Relay	4x100m Medley Relay	4x50m Mixed Freestyle Relay

EBL 22.9 A swimmer may also swim in one age category only in each of the following events

4x50m Freestyle Relay	4x100m Freestyle Relay
4x50m Medley Relay	4x100m Medley Relay

The purpose of this is:

- a) to ensure that a swimmer is not permitted to swim in one event twice e.g. a swimmer cannot swim in heat 1 and heat 4 of the same event.
- b) to ensure that a swimmer does not swim in two age groups in the same event e.g. cannot swim both the 13 & under 4x50 freestyle and the 15 & under 4x50 freestyle. A swimmer may however swim in one age group event and one open event for the same style and distance.

EBL 22.10 Multi-Class Relays

- Multi-Class Relays will be selected by SwimmingSA for State and Country Championships based upon the number of athletes with an impairment available for the event.
- Athletes will be allocated to teams of four swimmers where possible considering:
 - Availability of swimmers to make teams of four; and
 - Ability of swimmers; and
 - Impairment of swimmers.
- Medals will be awarded to the first, second and third placed teams with the winning team being the team with the highest percentage of the Multi-Class Point Score Base Time.

Calculation Formula:

$$(\text{MCPS Base Time} / \text{Team Swim Time}) * 100 = \text{Percentage}$$

- Points will not be awarded and where possible swimmers will compete in teams of mixed gender and club representation.

EBL 22.11 Relays in Open Club Carnivals

At Open Club Carnivals endorsed by SwimmingSA, In the case where a club has entered a relay team for an event at the Carnival and finds that it can no longer supply sufficient swimmers for that team (either insufficient numbers or not enough swimmers of the correct gender), they may, with the approval of the Referee, co-opt registered swimmers from their own club, another club or clubs to make up the numbers in the team or use swimmers of the wrong gender or both. The Referee may approve the team to swim in the heats. They will be called exhibition and may not score points or progress beyond the heats.

EBL 22.12 Swimming Australia's Coach Leadership Team may submit composite relay teams. Composite relay teams are not eligible to win medals and/or score points towards the club point score.

EBL 23 Protests and Jury of Appeal

(CBL 22)

The purpose of a protest is to resolve a dispute made by an individual, team or Club against a decision made by an official. A rule of fact cannot be protested against e.g. something demonstrated to exist or known to have existed; or a real occurrence; or an event. An example of this would be: that the swimmer was in the lane. Video/photographic evidence is not considered evidence and cannot be used in a protest.

EBL 23.1 Protests are possible

(CBL 22.1)

- (a) If the rules and regulations for the conduct of the competition are not observed
- (b) If other conditions endanger the competition and or swimmers or
- (c) Against the decisions of the Referee, however, no protests shall be allowed against decisions of fact

EBL 23.2 Protests must be submitted:

- (a) To the Referee
- (b) In writing on the SwimmingSA protest form setting out the reasons for the protest
- (c) By the responsible team manager
- (d) Together with a payment of \$100 AUD
- (e) Within 30 minutes following the posting of results for that specific event

If conditions causing a potential protest exist prior to the event a protest must be lodged before the signal to start is given.

EBL 23.3 All protests shall be considered by the Referee, taking into account the reasons for the protest (as set out in the SwimmingSA protest form) and any other information the Referee considers relevant. If the Referee rejects the protest, they must state the reasons for this decision. The team manager may appeal the rejection to the Jury of Appeal whose decision shall be final.

EBL 23.4 The Jury of Appeal for all SwimmingSA Approved Events shall consist of three people two of whom shall be Referees. The third person need not be a Referee but shall be an appropriately accredited and experienced SwimmingSA Technical Official.

EBL 23.5

- (a) The members of a Jury of Appeal shall elect a Chairperson.
- (b) All members of a Jury of Appeal shall be independent of the protest in question and the Referee against whose decision the protest has been lodged shall not influence the selection of the members of the jury or participate in its deliberations.
- (c) All parties involved in the protest, including the Referee against whose decision the protest has been lodged, who wish to address the jury shall be given the opportunity. The jury may at its discretion call any other involved parties to provide input.
- (d) If a Jury of Appeal cannot be convened the race shall be swum under protest.
- (e) If a race is swum under protest the Referee shall advise competitors accordingly and, if necessary, withhold the result of that race.
- (f) Protests not resolved by the Referee or because of an inability to convene a Jury of Appeal shall be referred to a Jury of Appeal comprising members appointed by the Technical Committee for a decision.
- (g) The Jury shall make its decision within 10 working days of the protest being received

EBL 23.6 If the protest is rejected, the deposit will be forfeited to SwimmingSA. If the protest is upheld the deposit will be returned. Team Managers will receive a copy of the completed Protest form.

CBL 24 General Swimwear Policy

CBL 24.1 All swimwear must be FINA approved.

CBL 24.2 Subject to CBL 24.6 and 24.7, In pool and open water swimming competitions the swimmer must wear only one swimsuit in one or two pieces. No additional items, like arm bands or leg bands shall be regarded as parts of a swimsuit. For pool swimming competitions swimsuits for men shall not extend above the navel nor below the knee, and for women, shall not cover the neck, nor extend past the shoulder, nor below the knee. The swimsuits shall be made from textile materials.

CBL 24.3 The swimwear (swimsuit, cap and goggles) of all swimmers shall be in good moral taste and suitable for the individual sports disciplines and are not to carry any symbol which may be considered offensive.

CBL 24.4 All swimsuits shall be non-transparent. It is permissible to wear two caps.

CBL 24.5 Modification of swimsuits to accommodate a swimmer's impairment is permitted as per **WPS10.15.2**. Proposed modified swimsuits shall be presented to the Technical Manager prior to the swimmers first event at the competition for approval.

CBL 24.6 Unless otherwise directed by Swimming Australia, swimmers may wear swimsuits that do not bear a valid FINA approval label provided they satisfy the material requirements outlined in the current FINA requirements for swimwear approval and meet the following criteria:

- (i) Men's swimsuits are limited to one (1) suit that covers at most the body surface from hips to knee/s. Swimsuits may not extend above the waist or below the knees;
- (ii) Women's swimsuits are limited to one (1) suit in up to two (2) pieces that is of 'open back' and 'open shoulder' designs that may extend down to the knee; swimsuits must not extend below the knees;
- (iii) No zippers or other fastening devices are allowed except for a waist tie; and
- (iv) Swimsuits must be of textile material (i.e. permeable textile open mesh materials such as cotton, nylon, lycra and the like) with no application of surface treatment closing the open mesh structure.

EBL 24.7 Not with standing any other clause in this by-law, swimsuits may be modified or alternative swimsuits may be worn to accommodate a swimmer's individual needs and preferences, including in respect of modesty, religious or cultural purposes, gender identity, physical disability or in connection with any other protected attribute under federal or state anti-discrimination legislation provided any modification or proposed alternative swimsuit:

- (a) complies with the Swimming Australia Inclusive Swimwear Policy; and
- (b) is approved by the Technical Manager prior to the swimmer's first event at the relevant competition.

EBL 28.8 The referee of a competition has the authority to exclude any swimmer whose swimsuit or body symbols do not comply with this rule.

CBL 25 Advertising

At Australian swimming events, competing clubs and swimmers must observe the following regarding advertising on clothing and equipment. Clubs and swimmers should note that CBL 25 is based on the FINA general rule GR6 and FINA by-law 7.

CBL 25.1 Swimsuits Identification in the Form of:

- (a) One manufacturer's logo of a maximum size of 30 square centimetres when worn. Where one-piece body suits are used, two logos of the manufacturer shall be permitted, one above the waist and one below the waist of a maximum size of 30 square centimetres each when worn. These two logos of the manufacturer shall not be placed immediately adjacent to each other. Where two-piece body suits are used, the two logos of the manufacturer shall be placed on one piece each
- (b) The manufacturer's logo must be calculated taking into consideration the entire surface of the logo. One sponsor's logo/name/insignia of a maximum of 30 square centimetres when worn. Clubs with commercial sponsorship opportunities that sit outside of the above points, should contact Swimming Australia for approval
- (c) The name and the logo of the Club/State of the swimmer shall not be regarded as advertisements

CBL 25.2 Club/State Caps:

- (a) One manufacturer's logo/name/insignia of a maximum of 20 square centimetres (when the cap is not being worn)
- (b) One sponsor name/logo/insignia not exceeding 20 square centimetres
- (c) The name and the logo of the Club/State of the swimmer shall not be regarded as advertisements

CBL 25.3 Goggles

Two manufacturer logos of a maximum size of six square centimetres each are allowed on goggles but only on the spectacle frame or band.

CBL 25.4 Pool Deck Equipment

All pool deck clothing, including those items listed below may carry two logos/names/insignia (one of the manufacturer and the other one of the sponsor) each with a maximum size of 40 square centimetres.

All accessories and equipment items listed below may carry two logos/names/insignia (one of the manufacturer and the other one of the sponsor) each with a maximum size of six square centimetres.

- (a) T shirt, polo, casual shirt, jumper, tracksuit top, bathrobe, deck coat, pants, shorts and skirts – 40 square centimetres
- (b) Towels, caps/hats, socks and footwear – six square centimetres
- (c) Bags – not greater than 10% of the surface area of the item, to a maximum of 60 square centimetres

For upper-body clothing items only, the manufacturer's logo being a design mark of maximum of eight centimetres in width may additionally be displayed in the form of a strip in one of the following positions: around the bottom of both sleeves or centred down the outer seam of both sleeves (from the collar across the top of the shoulders down to the bottom of the sleeve).

For lower-body clothing items only, the manufacturer's logo being a design mark of maximum of eight centimetres in width, may additionally be displayed in the form of a strip centred down the outer seam of both legs (from the waistband down to the bottom of the leg).

The name and the logo of the Club/State of the swimmer shall not be regarded as advertisements.

CBL 25.5 Body advertisement is forbidden.

EBL 25.6 Advertising for tobacco is not permitted. See EBL 10 for guidance with regards to Alcohol advertising.

CBL 25.7 These by-laws do not apply to design advertising and trademarks of Swimming Australia or its commercial partners, or the design advertising and trademarks of the major sponsor of a member organisation, so long as this does not conflict with a partner of Swimming Australia.

For the avoidance of doubt, the manufacturer logo cannot be the same as the sponsor logo.

CBL 25.8 Any advertising logos/identifications which are not indicated in CBL 25 are not permitted. In the event that any apparel contravenes these regulations, the club or swimmer must immediately remove the item/s and replace it with apparel which complies with these regulations. In the event that a breach is not immediately remedied, the club or swimmer may be requested to wear attire provided by Swimming Australia.

EBL 25.9 SwimmingSA reserves the right to inspect any apparel for approval prior to the commencement of the swimming events

CBL 26 Product Technology Identification

Where one-piece body suits (swimsuits or wetsuits) are used in competition, two product technology identifications shall be permitted, one above the waist and one below the waist, of a maximum size of 10 square centimetres each when worn. However these identifications shall not be placed immediately adjacent to each other, nor immediately adjacent to any manufacturer's logo. Where two-piece body suits are used, one product technology identification may be placed on each piece.

Other clothing: one additional identification allowed on clothing, limited to product technology identifications, with a maximum size of 10 square centimetres.

Product technology identifications means the technical identification (which shall not include any identification of the manufacturer, or any part thereof) used on clothing to identify any fabric technology.

EBL 27 Accreditation

(CBL 27)

When required accreditation credentials will be provided by SwimmingSA and must be worn fully visible when on pool deck and attending marshalling.

Accreditations will be granted as per the Pool Deck Access Policy ([Click Here](#)).

Accreditations will not be granted to any person who does not meet the Working with Children Check requirements.

Athletes must present their accreditation to the Marshall who will check the athlete in. Athletes will collect their accreditation from the accreditation desk post their race.

EBL 28 Strapping / Taping

Swimmers must cover any wounds with waterproof dressing (not band aids) and may after presentation to the Referee of the meet use tape to hold the dressing in place as long as it does not give the swimmer any advantage. Any other strapping must be presented to the Referee who will decide if it gives the swimmer any advantage. Strapping not approved by the Referee is forbidden.

EBL 29 Skins Events Protocols

When planning a Skins event it is essential to distinguish between a Skins event and a Dash for Cash. A Dash for Cash is a one heat event where the competitors are chosen from an earlier event in the programme as determined by the organizing group. Prizes as specified are awarded on the placings of that single heat. A Skins event is a series of heats or rounds where the slowest swimmer(s) are progressively eliminated according to a pre-determined plan with the final round determining the prize winner(s). The following instructions relate to planning and running a Skins event..

The first thing to determine is how many prizes are to be awarded. The usual is three but even if there are only two prizes, the aim is to generally have 3 swimmers compete in the last sprint. The other important issue is whether diving is permitted at both ends of the pool.

There is no rule that swimmers must swim to their best in any heats which will lead to a result in Skins. A rule for "swimming out" only applies to handicap events. Indeed in SKINS it is quite common for the fastest swimmers to save themselves in the first round or two.

- There can be any number of rounds but 3 to 5 is typical. This is determined by the organising committee. Examples could include:
 - If there are 10 swimmers, the 2 slowest swimmers are removed each time until just 2 swimmers compete for the top prize. This gives 5 rounds. Alternatively there could be 2 swimmers removed from each of the first two rounds then 3 from the 3rd round leaving 3 to contest the final 4th round.
 - For an 8 lane pool it is usual to have 4 rounds with the 2 slowest swimmers being removed in each of the first 2 rounds and 1 swimmer removed in the 3rd round. Other possibilities are 3 swimmers removed in the first round and then 2 swimmers in the next round and the 3rd and final round producing the prize winners.
 - For a 7 lane pool then 2 slowest swimmers are removed for each of the first two rounds, leaving 3 swimmers to compete in the 3rd and final round.
- Referees are in charge and must decide who will be judging the slowest swimmers to be removed at the end of each round. They should then record placings for all swimmers in the final round. The Referee will make the final decision.
- Events run where timing pads are in place shall use those times to determine the slowest swimmer(s). The rules relating to electronic timing apply. In the case where one swimmer does not activate the pads to record a time the Referee will act as place judge to eliminate the slowest swimmer(s). If this is not possible the additional swimmer(s) will proceed to the next round where the number of swimmers to be eliminated will be adjusted to still achieve the desired result from that round.
- In the case of equal times and therefore impossible to eliminate the desired number of swimmers, the additional swimmer(s) will proceed to the next round where the number of swimmers to be eliminated will be adjusted to still achieve the desired result from that round.
- If any swimmer is disqualified at any time then that swimmer is removed as one of the eliminated swimmers for that round. The disqualified swimmer is eliminated for the entire event and not able to receive any prize. If this happens in the last round then it is up to the organisers to have a stated decision on what happens to the prize money, ie. do not award the final prize, share the non-awarded prize between the other eligible finalists **or** offer it to the most recently removed swimmer. However, this last option is not always easy to determine so is not recommended. Before the event commences, the convening club must make all contestants aware of their plan should the occasion arise.
- In carnivals with semi-automatic timing systems (eg. Dolphin), the Referee may elect to use the timing system to assist their decision making however, the Referee's decision is always final.
- The most experienced Referee shall take lead control of all events involving prizes or prize money and be involved at the finish end. If separate male and female events are conducted, the same Referee will run both events.
- If swimmers are able to start from both ends of the pool, the Referee will allow **one minute** after the last touch before starting the next round. There will be a 10 second warning when the time is 10 seconds before the finish of the delay. The Referee will give the usual start signal (the long whistle and hand over to the starter) and the starter will treat it as a normal start (with the possibility of DQ – Started before the starting signal or delaying the start).
- If swimmers need to return to the other end of the pool to start, then the Referee will allow **one and a half minutes** for the delay with a 10 second warning as detailed above.

- Skins Events which sometimes form part of the Division 1 programme generally have only one prize, with two swimmers competing in the final round as outlined in the first dot point above. Details will be recorded in the Meet Programme.
- For Skins Events at Open Carnivals, the instructions in the Handbook should give an indication of what criteria are set for eligibility and what method will be used at that pool. These conditions and instructions must also be repeated in the Carnival Programme. If the instructions are not clear the Referees should consult with the Meet Director and make a decision. The Announcer should be given the details and Referees should call all the swimmers together before the first round and clearly state the rules that will be followed.

EBL 30 Split Times

At all events held at the SA Aquatic and Leisure Centre, the following procedures apply for split times:

- Referees will only accept split time requests for all backstroke swims.
- All other swims/splits required and not mentioned in EBL 30 (a) will be automatically collated through the AOE.
- For athletes wishing to achieve split times for events noted in EBL 30 (a), a Certificate of Performance form will need to be handed to the Referee at least 30 minutes before the start of the session.

EBL 31 Officials

- All persons appointed as an official (whether accredited or not) are required to comply with the relevant Working With Children Check Legislation.
- All Officials at SwimmingSA meets are expected to remain at their stations until advised by the Announcer or the Technical Manager.
- For all SA Championships, wherever possible senior accredited Referees and Starters should be rostered to officiate at all sessions of these meets.
- If an error by an official follows a fault by a swimmer, the fault by the swimmer may be expunged. The accidental omission by an official to perform their duties shall not prevent an event being properly conducted unless such omission has prejudiced the changes of any swimmer in a material way.

EBL 36 National Qualifying Time Trial Procedure

The aim of this procedure is to allow swimmers a final chance to achieve National Qualifying times. Swimmers cannot seek a time trial for an event where they already hold a National Qualifying time.

- A Time Trial will only be conducted if there is not a SwimmingSA meet scheduled within two weekends of the closing date of the relevant National Championship.
- Should a Time Trial become necessary as per EBL 36 (a), details of the entry process will be published by SwimmingSA
- If a Time Trial is conducted, a swimmer may only nominate if their time is within National Qualifying times by:
 - 0.50 sec for 50 m
 - 1.00 sec for 100 m
 - 2.00 secs for 200 m
 - 4.00 secs for 400 m or longer.

EBL 37 Backstroke Ledges

Backstroke ledges, if available, will be used in individual events and the Open Medley Relays at State Championships (LC and SC) at SAALC.

The ledges are to be put in place by the IOT in each lane but the swimmer should adjust the setting to his/her preference. If the swimmer does not wish to use the ledge the IOT is to safely and carefully remove it from the water according to National protocol. The IOT must also remove the ledge from the water prior to the first turn or the finish whichever comes first.

For Open Medley Relays the ledges must be fully removed from the block to allow block use by the next swimmer.

The use of Backstroke Ledges at non-championship events remains at the discretion of SwimmingSA.

EBL 38 Lane Sales

The Board of SwimmingSA has approved Lane Sales for specific meets at SAALC. Sales will not be available for any session of Championship meets. Sales are offered under the following conditions.

- (a) Candidates for a lane sale must satisfy the age, gender and stroke criteria for the specified event.
- (b) Swimmers must purchase an unallocated lane sale through Swim Central and submit their form for consideration to events@sa.swimming.org.au.
 - The purchase price will be listed on Swim Central, however is generally double the price of nominations made by the closing date (plus fees and charges).
 - A refund (minus fees and charges) will be available for an unallocated lane sale request unable to be fulfilled.
 - Cash for lane sales will not be accepted.
- (c) Unallocated lanes will be allocated on a first come first serve basis as available when forms are received up to 24hrs prior to the start of the meet or 9am on the last business day prior to the commencement of the meet.
 - Lane sales will not be accepted on the day of the meet.
- (d) A swimmer successfully being allocated a lane will be entered as exhibition and will not be eligible for any awards or progress beyond this one swim in the event.
- (e) Sales can only be approved for lanes not allocated prior to the close of entries.
 - Allocations are made in Heat 1 in the first instance and only if there is a greater demand can any unallocated lanes in Heat 2 be sold.
 - Lanes previously purchased under normal entry conditions, and which are now vacant are not for sale.
- (f) A swimmer successfully being allocated a lane will be entered as exhibition and will not be eligible for any awards or progress beyond this one swim in the event.

Sales at Open Carnivals are an option available to convening clubs. Sales are to be offered under the following conditions.

- (a) Conditions for lane sales must be stipulated prior to the meet. In the case where there are more requests than lanes available, the successful requests will be decided by a draw at the time. The swimmer will be entered as Exhibition and not eligible for any awards or points or to progress beyond this one swim in the event.
- (b) The convening club must be able to print updated programmes for key officials, including the system in use for Marshals and Check Starters.
- (c) Any club which prefers to print the programme after withdrawals on the day, must develop their own procedure in line with this By-Law.
- (d) It is recommended that cash payments NOT be taken for lane sales by the host club.

EBL 40 Warm Up

- (a) Officials rostered to perform warm-up duties must be on pool deck at the published time for the commencement of warm-up.
- (b) Any swimmer not complying with the safety aspects of warm-up should be reported immediately to the Referee. Dangerous behaviour will result in immediate suspension of the swimmer from the rest of warm-up and may result in the Referee excluding the swimmer from their first event of that session.
- (c) At any carnival where the warm-up procedure and conditions are not published in the Carnival Programme, no warm-up can commence until the Meet Director and the Referee have decided on the procedure and conditions and these have been publicised by an announcement of times and conditions.

EBL 41 Emergency Powers

Under special circumstances the Board may:

- (a) cancel or suspend all or any event or Championships; and/or
- (b) suspend and approve other awards for events and places in lieu of medals and points
